2020-2021 FHU Advancement Awards

The FHU Office of University Advancement (which serves as the bridge between FHU and the Associates) recognizes the valuable contribution of the FHU Associates over the years. Because of the hard work and selfless attitudes, the Associates are directly responsible for more than \$4 million given to the university over the past 50+ years.

The Office of University Advancement honors two special members of the Associates each year who have distinguished themselves in areas of service. The LaVonne B. Scott "Heart of a Servant" Award and the "Leap of Faith" Award were conceived as a way to honor exemplary service and to say "Thank you" for the great work that the Associates as a whole (and these two members, in particular) are doing. The "Heart of a Servant" Award is named in honor of LaVonne Scott who continued to work tirelessly for the mission of the FHU Associates until she was in her 90's. This award is given to an Associate who exemplifies the heart of a servant – who is happy to work at projects (even in the thankless jobs), who is excited about our mission, and who does not ask for recognition, but who deserves to be honored.

The "Leap of Faith" Award is given to the Associate who is an innovator, an encourager – an Associate who, perhaps, is responsible for getting a new project off the ground or who came up with a "big new idea" and had the courage to follow it through. This award honors the Associate who ays "We can do that!"

Below are this year's award winners along with the nomination letters we received, explaining why these two ladies are so deserving of these awards.

LaVonne Scott "Heart of a Servant" Award – Joan Rhea

Many Associates work tirelessly to complete projects raising scholarship funds for FHU students. One sweet lady that works in such a way and is not the type to seek recognition for her service is **Mrs. Joan Rhea**. "Whatever 'Mrs. Joan' does, she works heartily, as for the Lord and not for men" (Colossians 3:23) and especially not for personal recognition. This is why we wish to nominate Mrs. Joan Rhea for the 2021 LaVonne B. Scott "Heart of a Servant" Award.

If you live in Henderson and carry a Bible bag it was very likely handmade by Joan Rhea. Many homeless have received an "Ugly Quilt" handmade by Joan Rhea. They may have also received a care package of food and toiletry items made by Mrs. Joan too. She's made decorative pillowcases for Le Bonheur Hospital patients and she collects calendars for the local nursing home residents. Several FHU students have received help when in need because of her generosity. These are a few of her projects that flow from her beautiful servant's heart.

This same heart is dedicated to the mission of the FHU Associates. Because of this dedication Mrs. Joan keeps her hands busy on a wide variety of projects. Mrs. Joan's special cookies show up at most every Associate Event. It would be safe to say she's made 100's of dozens of her special cookies. She has helped with the Rummage Sale in various ways. Together with her daughters she rescues items others toss out and cleans these items so they can be used by others and sold at the Rummage Sale. She helps revive tired rummage sale workers who often can't leave for meals, by providing more cookies. Mrs. Joan also serves as a caller for the Calling Committee which helps ensure all events are equipped and staffed for success

During this year of quarantining while many Associate projects have been canceled, Mrs. Joan has kept her hands busy providing for the increase in Sunshine Boxes. Creating handmade masks (100+), colorful pillowcases, and encouraging bookmarks. These helped fill the boxes with one of a kind personal items. Profits increased for this project because of her donation of all these items.

Mrs. Joan Rhea is a humble servant that willingly donates her time, talents and resources to ensure the success of the Associates mission. She is very deserving of the "Heart of a Servant" Award and we hope you will give her your utmost consideration.

Freed-Hardeman University Associates Winter National Meeting February 27, 2021, Hope Barber Shull ARC By Shila England, National Secretary

The Freed-Hardeman University Associates who met for the Winter National Meeting on February 27, 2021 were welcomed by National President Shirley Eaton and National Vice President, Diane Smith, introduced the devotional speaker, Nadine McNeal.

Following the devotional, Shirley Eaton called the meeting to order. Members were asked to take a few cards and write a note to this year's scholarship recipients.

Jeanita Estes of the Booneville chapter shared a special report with those present at this meeting. Ms. Estes spoke about long time FHU Associates' member Wanda Sweeney. Ms. Sweeney was a member of the Booneville chapter who served in any capacity she was able for many years. Even as her health declined, she was present with a smile and ready to be put to work wherever possible. Ms. Sweeney passed to her eternal reward in November of 2020 and graciously left a portion of her estate to the FHU Associates in the sum of \$60,000. A check was presented to the Associates a few weeks prior to the meeting. We are so thankful for the generosity and Christian spirit of Ms. Sweeney, and know that this donation will be put to good use as many students will be blessed because of it.

The minutes from the previous national meeting were presented to the group and stand approved. Chris Gann presented the treasurer's report and gave a report on the standings of all accounts. At the time of this meeting there was a total of \$79,886.98 in all accounts.

Debbie McLaughlin reported on this year's scholarship recipients. There are 43 scholarship recipients for the 2020-2021 school year including 2 endowed scholarship recipients. A total of \$8,000 was able to be given to the endowed students this year. Debbie McLaughlin reported that \$4,000+ was raised on the FHU Day of Giving for the Associates and that the goal is to donate at least \$65,000 to students every year. The goal for the 2020-2021 school year has been surpassed at this time due to the donation from Ms. Wanda Sweeney.

Lynne Golson reported for the Membership Committee. Ms. Jean Marilyn Hogan was presented with a Gold Membership prior to this national meeting. Debbie McLaughlin reported that there are efforts for two possible

new Associates chapters. One in the southern region of Nashville, TN and a second in Huntsville, AL. Later this year FHU Associates will work with the Presidential Trek to see if there is interest.

Connie Pritchard presented on the National Projects Committee. She stated that the Merry Market in collaboration with the FHU Benefit Dinner was successful. FHBrew sales have moved online and so far this year have raised over \$3000 and sales are continuing. Dining Services served FHBrew coffee at the Benefit Dinner and will serve and sell it at the Golden Year Reunion as well. Book sales have been slow this year due to the pandemic, but 5 sales have occurred since January 2021. Connie Pritchard is the new contact for Rada Knife sales as Jean Marilyn Hogan is in the process of moving.

Laurel Sewell reported on the Hardeman House. There have been thirteen overnight stays in the current school year. FHU has hosted eleven events and there have been eleven non-FHU rentals. Two weddings have been hosted at the Hardeman House this school year as well.

Martha Alls presented for the Nominating Committee. All executives from the current year have been nominated to remain for another year (President Shirley Eaton, Vice President Diane Smith, Treasurer Chris Gann, and Secretary Shila England). This was motioned by Connie Pritchard and seconded by Debbie McLaughlin and the motion was accepted.

In chapter reports, Martha Alls reported that they were able to donate the dessert risers that are needed for lectureship every year. Booneville reported that Covid-19 has made their usual efforts cancelled for the year, but that they have continued with knife sales. Chester County reported that they have had a successful year despite the pandemic struggles. The fall rummage sale brought in \$17,500. Sunshine Boxes have expanded beyond campus and have brought in \$11,000 (591 boxes) since April of 2019. The Chester County Associates have also assisted with catering at the Hardeman House and serving meals in Wallace-Gano to students. The dining staff have returned the favor by donating funds for the Sunshine boxes.

A special update on giving goals was presented by Debbie McLaughlin and Shirley Eaton. The Associates are on track to finish this year with a total of \$4,000,000 given to the University since 1963. The Associates are in the top ten all-time of donors to the University. At the time of the winter meeting there was a need of \$17,656.62 to reach the goal.

The Spring National Meeting is tentatively set for May 7, 2021. This meeting will include year end awards and the office installation for the next year. Diane Smith led a closing prayer to conclude the meeting.

An abbreviated spring business meeting was held on April 16, 2021, after the appreciation lunch provided by the Board of Trustees. At this brief meeting, returning officers for 2021-2022 were confirmed. Advancement Awards were given during the lunch. Minutes and financial statements normally presented will be given at the Fall, 2021, national meeting.
