ADDITIONAL ITEMS RELATED TO THE MAJOR

*Digital Graphic Fundamentals, Graphic Design 1 and Graphic Design 2 are taught on a rotating schedule. They could be offered in the fall or spring of any given year depending on the rotation. A student beginning their first semester could take Digital Graphic Fundamentals if it is offered or may have to wait until the next fall if it is not offered at that time.

- 3. Before the enrollment period, check to make sure holds will not prevent you from registration.
- 4. Register for classes early during the registration period to secure classes.
