## ADDITIONAL ITEMS RELATED TO THE MAJOR

Nursing program acceptance requires 1) an overall GPA of 2.80, 2) a science GPA of 2.50 (no science grade less than a C), and 3) a TEAS score of Proficient or higher, and TEAS science score of 52.1% or higher.

\*Behavioral Science: Students are strongly encouraged to take PSY210 General Psychology.

\*\*Elective: The following are recommended electives: BIO115 Medical Terminology (2hr); PSY218 Abnormal Psychology (3hr); PSY310 Developmental Psychology (3hr); HEA310 Community Health (3hr); HEA316 Substance Abuse Education (3hr); HEA410 The School Health Program (3hr); NSG299/399 Nursing Medical Missions: Haiti; NSG396/496 Field Laboratory; NSG397/497 Practicum or Internship. 1. Plan schedules carefully. Plan to fulfill prerequisites for future courses.
2. Do not alter the sequence of courses without consulting with your academic adviser as not all classes are offered every semester.

4. Register for classes early during the registration period to secure classes.
