## ADDITIONAL ITEMS RELATED TO THE MAJOR

-Students must be admitted to Teacher Education before taking professional core EDU & RDG courses.

-Additional licensure requirement: HEA 217 - First Aid & CPR OR Red Cross Training.

-Take the appropriate PRAXIS exams required for licensure for this major. Contact the College of Education Licensure Officer for information regarding the PRAXIS exams.

-Must choose one of the following options: Option 1: ENG 101, 102, 225, 235, and 305; Option 2: BIO 111, 112, PHS 111, 112, and 6 BIO/PHS upper division hours; Option 3: HIS 111, 112, 221, 222, 424, and POL 231 or 232; Option 4: MAT 100, 101, 206, 235, and 306. Note: Students who elect Option 2 or Option 4 may count the upper division requirement for the upper division math/science elective.

\*Fulfills additional requirement for 3-4 hours of math or science for the B.S. degree.
