APPRECIATION DINNER TO HONOR FHU ASSOCIATES

The 2024 Annual Bible Lectureship is dedicated to the selfless group of women, past and present, known as the Freed-Hardeman University Associates.

On September 5, 1963, ladies whose husbands were members of the Freed-Hardeman College Board of Trustees and Advisory Board met for the purpose of planning a women's organization to help support and encourage Christian education at Freed-Hardeman College in Henderson, Tennessee. Mrs. Neal Penny of Milan, Tennessee, presided at the meeting and was elected the first president. In late 1963 and early 1964, chapters of the Freed-Hardeman Associates were organized in west Tennessee, Kentucky, north Alabama and Mississippi. Over the last 60 years the FHU Associates has been made up of career women, stay-at-home moms, retirees, young alumni and other outstanding women who have put others before themselves.

In his 2020 book titled "By the Grace of God: The Story of Freed-Hardeman University," Dr. Greg Massey shared that the Associates, in their first few years, raised funds for a new bus that transported the FHC Chorus, a speech lab, a campus radio station and funds to build new buildings including Loyd Auditorium and the FHU Associates Science Center (pages 215-16). Since its beginning the Associates have raised almost \$4.5 million for student scholarships, while also being a constant source of help for the FHU Lectureship. Whether through their F.H. Brew coffee, the Lectureship Kitchen, rummage sales, tea parties, cookbooks, hospitality at the Hardeman House, ladies' Bible study books, Sunshine Boxes or many other thoughtful means of outreach, the FHU Associates have been a blessing to many. The FHU Associates believe in the power of a Christian education at FHU and have given their time, talents and financial resources to that end.

WHAT'S NEW AT THE 2024 LECTURESHIP?

There are some features of the Lectureship that are favorites from year-toyear, but this year there are several new aspects of the program that we hope will be among your favorite features as well.

- 1. A Balanced Focus on the Difficult Text of Revelation It seems that many students of the Bible either ignore the Book of Revelation or build too much on an anachronistic interpretation of the book. The Lectureship has been designed to focus on the key themes and passages of the Book of Revelation, while not getting "lost in the weeds." In addition to the chapel sessions and keynotes, other sessions specifically connected to Revelation include a survey of the whole book (Monday, 8:30-10:20 a.m., Loyd) and fourteen other series throughout the week that will address issues related to the interpretation and application of this God-inspired book.
- 2. Healthy Families and Individuals On Wednesday, February 7, the FHU Lectureship will feature a "Sexual Integrity Workshop" led by Jonathan Harrison which will help attendees to think about human sexuality in a healthy way. For adults who choose to attend, these much-needed sessions will focus on how to handle temptation in a healthy way, while also addressing many of the challenges that Christians face today with addiction, counseling, culture and education. In addition to this, two series on the family in the Butts Family Conference room at 1:30 and 2:30 each afternoon, coordinated by Dr. Ryan Fraser, will encourage all who attend to think more intentionally about healthy families.
- 3. FHU Campus Involvement We are delighted that many at FHU outside of the College of Biblical Studies actively participate in the Annual Bible Lectureship. In addition to the FHU College of **Education** again hosting our Kids' Lectureship in the Henderson church of Christ Activity Center, the FHU College of Business will be hosting a series on "Best Business Practices for Congregations" (Mon-Thurs., 2:30 p.m., Aud D). Also, the FHU University Counseling Center under the direction of Nathan Judd will be hosting our Late Nite Lectures in Chapel Hall at 10:30 p.m.
- **Relevant Ministry Emphasis** Christians and congregations are constantly being challenged with how to best serve others and the 2024 Lectureship has been designed with some of those challenges in mind. Jason Helton and Blaine McKinney will lead a three-day series titled "Ministry & Media: How to Minister Online" (Tues.-Thurs. 8:30 a.m., Aud D); another series will address how congregations can thrive when they are small, in urban settings or outside the Bible belt (Tues.-Thurs. 9:30 a.m., Aud D), while Marshall Danby and Timothy Hall will lead a series on the effective prison ministry work being operated by the Central church of Christ in Johnson City, Tennessee (Tues.-Thurs., 9:30 a.m., Butts Family Conference room).

We have prayerfully prepared every session and series in the 2024 Lectureship with hopes that God will be glorified and attendees will grow in faith. We hope you will take advantage of each of these opportunities.







JOHNSON TO RECEIVE HONORARY DOCTORATE

Roy Johnson has been preaching for 50 years, including 18 years at Campbell Springs church of Christ in Ashland, Alabama. He has been an elder at three congregations and is currently serving as an elder for the Sylacauga church of Christ in Sylacauga, Alabama. Johnson was a top-level executive for the Boy Scouts of America for 23 years before taking on the role as executive director of Lads to Leaders in January 2003. His last position with the BSA was as scout executive in Butler, Pennsylvania, near Pittsburgh for three years.

Johnson was one of the first young lads trained by Dr. Zorn in Lads to Leaders in the summer of 1968. As one of the first Lads scholarship recipients at Alabama Christian College, Johnson traveled with Dr. Zorn to 28 states. As the current executive director of L2L, Johnson speaks at over one hundred congregations per year. He is a member of the Faulkner University Board of Trustees, Freed-Hardeman President's Council and numerous other boards.

Johnson comes from a long line of church leaders. His greatgrandfather was one of the founding members of the Hollins church of Christ in the early 1900s. Johnson's grandfather was an elder and had the distinction of having every child, grandchild and great-grandchild become a member of the church. Johnson's father served as an elder, his brother is currently an elder and his sister (now deceased) was married to a preacher. Johnson is married to the former Brenda Hurt and they have three grown sons, Bryan (Adrienne Ray), Ben (Alison Walsh) and Brad (Madison Campbell). The Johnsons have five granddaughters and four grandsons.




